

Pupil Premium Grant Expenditure for Sandfield Park School

The pupil premium is allocated to schools on the basis of the number of students on roll known to be eligible for Free School Meals currently or who have claimed within the last 5 years, as well as students who have been Looked After by the Local Authority for more than 6 months and those children of services personnel.
